We had a lovely Wedding and Baptism in July and wish Debbie, Will and Thomas Ellicott all the very best for the future and to Delta Rose Quartly -Hall who was Baptised in June. We have had a sung Compline service most months since May and although this is a service that may not appeal to some, those who do attend (increasing slowly in number) enjoy this short service of about 20 minutes to give the chance in our busy lives to stop and reflect. We will start them again in the Spring and invite others outside the benefice. Harvest service had the rousing West Somerset Brass Band (with a good lot of younger players) and a visit from the Revd Jeyapaul who had the original idea of helping to educate poor Indian girls which is now an active charity, supported in England by Revds. Ben and Kathryn Flenley, who brought home to us the basic needs of others that are still lacking in other countries and the difference in harvests.
